
SSBA join Unity Lottery giving you the chance to win £25,000 every week

Linda has first hand experiences with spina bifida and the Association, as her son, Steven Mathers, and grandson, Dylan Forman, were both born with the condition.


Carol Donald, who is assisting with the organisation of the event along with Fiona Smith,

The Scottish Spina Bifida Association receive less than 4% in government funding yet need to raise over £500,000 to maintain the current level of services offered to over 3,000 children, young people and adults affected by spina bifida and/or hydrocephalus and allied conditions across Scotland.
