A DAY IN THE LIFE of...

Stewart Mackay, an adventurous fundraiser



On 22nd April 2007, Stewart Mackay, accompanied by George Angus, Graeme Mclean and Kenny Baillie, set off on a challenge of their own invention, The Far North West Cycle and Hillwalking Challenge. Stewart has a daughter with spina bifida and wanted to raise funds and awareness of the Association which is close to his heart. The challenge, a 190 mile cycle including the climb of Ben Hope, had its ups and downs but was well worth it as Stewart and his friends raised over £1.600.

The following are snippets of the diary which he wrote during the challenge...

22nd April: We set off from Culrain and headed towards Scourie Campsite, approx 80 miles away. The weather was fine as we set off and stayed pretty fine most of the way, any rain just added to the atmosphere of being in the Highlands. We soon had our first and hardest climb of the challenge, it was about a mile long, quite steep and was very hard work but we made it and the thrill of coming down the other side was well worth the climb. We reached Scourie campsite at about 3pm and went out for a meal, a few pints of Guinness and

a wee laugh before we retired for the night.

23rd April: We headed for the bottom of Ben Hope (approx 60 miles). The first leg of the journey took us to Durness where we had a couple of hours off the bikes and wandered about the

beautiful beach there. Then onto Ben Hope, a tough 30 miles because we cycled into the wind and the last 6 miles or so I was on my own as Kenny had to pull out due to the fact his ankle was really hurting him. When I finally reached the bottom of the mountain we then set up camp on the shore of Loch Hope and settled in for the night.

24th April: The weather was stunning, we couldn't have asked for a better day. Unfortunately George took a stumble as we were going up the mountain and hurt his knee so he went back down and Graeme and myself continued. It was worth the pain as finally we were standing at the top of Ben Hope and seeing a view that I cannot describe to you unless you were there (pictured below).



25th April: The final hurdle - We set off for Bonar Bridge (approx 50 miles). It was a wild day with the wind blowing in my face all the way to the finish line.

It was brilliant to cross the finish line at Bonar Bridge and I punched the air with delight, I didn't realise that I would feel as happy as I did and I had a tear in my eye and said to myself, "that was for you Murran" (Murran is my daughter who suffers from spina bifida). When we got to the B&B I was presented with a bottle of champagne by Graeme which was duly opened and consumed (mostly by me).



"I have

to let you know that I had great pleasure in doing the event and I am so happy that I have managed to do it for a cause that affects my life in ways I didn't realise it did until I did the event".
