ne Westerwood

A WEEK IN THE LIFE of...

lan Calder, a Scottish Spina Bifida Association Fundraiser

May was a big month for Ian Calder, as a supporter of the Association, he made the decision to walk the West Highland Way (WHW). Getting sponsored along the way he successfully raised £1300 and below are snippets from his diary.......



Day 1. 17th May Milngavie to Drymen - 12 miles

Left Milngavie at 12:00 and had a pleasant uphill walk through Mugdock Country Park and continued passed Carbeth before heading downhill towards Glengoyne Distillery. Continued onto Drymen, arriving, albeit with sore feet, at 16:30.

Day 2. 18th May. Drymen to Rowardennan – 15 miles.

Departed Drymen at 08:30 and took the main route over Conic Hill. From the top at 358M you could see way beyond Glasgow to the south and up to the Ben Lomond to the north. Arrived in Balmaha at 11:50. Reached Rowardennan at 15:45 where a family stopped us to donate £5.00.

Day 3. 19th May . Rowardennan to Crianlarich - 20 Miles.

Left Rowardennan at 08:40 heading for Inversnaid. Path to Crianlarich was mainly in open countryside so views were fantastic. Arrived in Crianlarich at 19:00 very tired and weary.

Day 4. 20th May. Crianlarich to Bridge of Orchy – 13 miles

Left Crianlarich at 09:30. Arrived in Tyndrum at 12:50 and had some refreshments sitting on a bench just outside the Green Wellie. Set off again at 13:30 for Bridge of Orchy. Stayed the night in a bunkhouse adjoining the Hotel where we had a good meal and couple of pints of Greene King IPA. Fortunately the barrel ran out otherwise I don't think I would have made it up the next day.

Day 5. 21st May . Bridge of

Left Bridge of Orchy at 08:30 and had a very pleasant walk to Kinghouse, 12 miles away. This part of the WHW is probably the most scenic section. It took us over Rannoch Moor and then over a hill into the head of Glencoe where we had great views of the Southern Hills and in particular Buachille Etive Mor. After a break, set off at 14.00 for Kinlochleven. The first 2 miles were easy but then we had a steep climb up the Devil's Staircase 260 M in height. Once on top we had spectacular view to the North and the South, Ben Nevis standing out proudly amongst the surrounding hills. The last section of today's route was difficult in that we dropped 400m very steeply. 18:00 - pretty tired after our 21 mile trek.

Day 6. Kinlochleven to Fort William – 14 miles

Had a good nights sleep and good Scottish Breakfast before setting off at 09:30. After a 260m, 45 minute climb, it was a relatively easy stroll all the way

spent on the WHW this one seemed to be the busiest. We met up with some new people and more familiar faces. Decided to go straight to the Youth Hostel in Glen Nevis rather than finish the last 2 miles as I was struggling a bit with my blister. Arrived at Glen Nevis Youth Hostel at 16:15

Day 7. Glen Nevis to Fort William – 2 miles.

Had a nice stroll along Glen Nevis to the official end of the WHW where we took some pictures. I made it, what a relief. Felt extremely proud to have completed it. After a 4 hour journey by train arrived back in Glasgow at 16:00.

She continued, "We'd asked the towns folk to put up balloons and banners to show their support and we couldn't believe their response; the whole town seemed to be awash with balloons, banners and ribbons."
